


WIND DELIVERS TAX RELIEF IN IOWA

- \$67 million annually in payments to landowners
- \$57 million in taxes in 2021



Iowans Will Save Billions with More Wind Energy!

20 GW of Wind Saves...

- Consumers **\$12.6 billion** over 25 years, with average annual savings of over **\$500 million**
- **\$3,200** on average household electric bills over 25 years
- **\$825,000** for industrial consumers over 25 years¹
